

## SHOW SITE EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN

Knowing what to do in an emergency will minimize risk to you, your health, and your co-workers. At times, hazards can warrant an evacuation of a facility or location. Knowing how and where to evacuate can be the difference between life and death.

A priority is to contact the facility where you are working and obtain their Emergency Action Plan (EAP). This will provide direction on correctly working within the facility's guidelines.

## If a hazard that warrants an evacuation exists, follow these steps:

- 1. Locate and determine the safest places to re-group.
- 2. Designate a safety lead responsible for a head count.
- 3. Conduct a head count once evacuated.
- 4. If not all members are present, notify emergency responders of the last known location (do not be a hero)
- 5. All evacuated employees must stay in the designated location.

## In the event of severe weather, follow these steps:

- 1. Designate safe cover areas before severe weather approaches.
- 2. Ensure that these areas are easily accessible and that employees have knowledge of them.
- Once the weather passes and it's safe, re-group for a head count; evaluate if injuries have occurred and seek medical treatment.

## If there is a threat at the designated location, follow these steps:

- 1. Run- Evacuate the location and get a safe distance from the danger.
- 2. Hide- Put yourself somewhere you will not be visible to the threat.
- 3. Fight- Last Resort- if you cannot safely Run or Hide, then protect yourself.
