#### Incident Summary:

The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) continues to monitor the evolving Coronavirus Disease, also known as COVID-19, situation closely. CISA is taking part in interagency and industry coordination calls and working with critical infrastructure partners to prepare for possible disruptions to critical infrastructure that may stem from widespread illness.

FEMA reports approximately 14,765,256 (+202,706 in the last 24 hours) cases and 612,054 (+4,273) deaths worldwide. In the U.S. there are approximately 3,871,345 (+52,206) cases and 140,985 (+355) deaths.

#### Key Points:

- FEMA deployed 2,245 (+9) employees in support of COVID-19 response
- 50,343,272 (+1,740,157) COVID-19 tests administered nationwide as of 22 Jul
- Cases are beginning to decrease in Arizona, making it only one of six states trending in that direction

#### CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE IMPACTS:

#### HEALTHCARE AND PUBLIC HEALTH

The CDC has added "cancer" to the list of high-risk underlying conditions for those who contract COVID-19.

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Fifty-three of Florida's hospitals have reached bed capacity in their ICUs, including eight hospitals in Miami-Dade County.

Missouri has reached a single-day record for new cases. Missouri's state health department is reporting positive cases are up 2.93 percent over the last seven days.

The Governor of New Jersey has expanded the state's COVID-19 quarantine travel advisory to 31 states.

The Governor of Oregon announced a hospital surge plan, which includes seven facilities with 340 beds for COVID patients.

Texas reported 197 COVID-related fatalities on 22 Jul, the highest number for the state yet. The state also reported a record number of hospitalizations (nearly 11,000). Crematoriums in Hidalgo County, at the southern tip of the state on the U.S. border with Mexico, has a wait list of two weeks.

### TRANSPORTATION SYSTEMS

(Maritime Transportation)

Princess Cruises has suspended service to U.S. ports through December 15, 2020. This date is well beyond the Sept. 30 "No Sail Order" issued by the CDC.

### ACTIVATIONS AND DECLARATIONS

DHS announced it will extend restrictions on non-essential travel at U.S. land borders with Canada and Mexico through 20 Aug.

Thirty-one states as well as Puerto Rico and the District of Columbia have issued requirements for facial coverings in public. States include: AL, AZ, AR, CA, CO, CT, DE, HI, IL, IN, KS, KY, LA, ME, MD, MA, MI, MN, NV, NJ, NM, NY, NC, OH, OR, PA, RI, TX, VA, WA, WV.

NY: The governor announced new regulations for bars and restaurants in NYC to ensure they are complying with state social distancing and face covering orders. New York City has entered phase four of reopening.

Zero states and territories have complete stay-at-home orders in place. Four states have stay-at-home orders; however, only limited movement restrictions. Forty states and territories have lifted their stay-at-home orders, though other movement restrictions may still apply. Two states lifted state-wide orders, but maintain regional stay at home orders. Three states have not issued state-wide stay at home orders and have lifted all regional orders. Seven states and territories never enacted stay at home orders.

Zero states/territories have all restrictions on nonessential businesses in-place; zero states/territories have lifted limited restrictions on nonessential businesses; seven states have lifted some restrictions; one state/territory has regional lifting of some restrictions; thirty-five states have lifted most restrictions; two states have regional lifting of



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most restrictions; seven states have lifted all restrictions; two states have not closed nonessential businesses; and two states are special cases.
